



### **General Manager's Report**

The Summer of 2013 is almost over and to our surprise we had plenty of water in the lake to enjoy. Let's hope that this winter gives us some big rain storms to fill the lake to the 800' level. While we had a busy summer the staff was able to keep up with the work load on normal maintenance and still make improvements to the common area. The community is changing. This year we got many new owners who are very excited about being in Oak Shores. Several of these new owners are retired and will live here full time. Below are some items I want to share with all the owners.

### **Community Safety**

I wanted to give all of you an overview of our camera system in the community. At the gate we have 11 cameras that monitor the coming and

going of all vehicles. We also have a camera in the gate house for staff safety with a microphone that records all conversations. If you or someone you know fails to stop at the stop signs at the gate house, runs the gate to get in without a pass or speeds, they will be caught. We also have cameras at the Clubhouse for building security. The maintenance yard also is equipped with a camera system to protect our valuable equipment at that location. Each system has a DVR and can be viewed remotely. If it happens we will know. Our code staff also wears video cameras for documenting any incidents that might occur in the community. The two patrol trucks also have dash video camera.

### **Hazardous Fuel Reduction**

2013 saw another outstanding year for our hazardous fuel reduction program. We were able to get the California Conservation Corps into the community for four weeks worth of work. The Cuesta Camp Crews (inmates) worked in the community also up until the fire season started which started early this year. We received notification that we will receive \$15,000 from a \$300,000 federal fire grant that the Fire Safe Counsel applied for and got. The Lake Nacimiento area was determined to be the number one priority in the state for Cal Fire. This went a long way in getting the necessary money for reducing the fuel load around the lake.

We had the Cuesta Camp (inmate) crews chipping the burn pile instead of burning, as this year was one of the driest ones on record. Starting a burn was not allowed. We are opening the burn again to homeowners, so when you need to get rid of brush and limbs contact the office for arrangements. We are planning on doing a chipping program this year and next year to kick start the efforts of you, the homeowners, in cleaning up your trees and brush. Stay tune for details.

The Fire Wise Committee is actively working on getting the education component of the Fire Wise program going in the community. The purpose of the Fire Wise program is to empower home owners to learn how to make their homes survive a fire in the community. The committee will be sponsoring a chipping program in 2014. Details on the program will be in the next Oak Leaves.

### **Oak Shores Banding Program**

We have been working with the County of San Luis Obispo on doing a banding program for the boats and watercraft that do not leave the community. The county supplied us with very durable bands we can use to band your boat. Give the office or the gate a call, and they will get Code Enforcement to come by your home to band your boat or watercraft. Banding will allow you to get your boat or watercraft through the mussel inspection procedure much faster.


My priority would be to maintain the integrity and reputation of Oak Shores.

### A SPARROW BY ANY OTHER NAME

I am sure most of you can identify Captain Jack Sparrow, the fictional character from Pirates of the Caribbean. Johnny Depp based his character's dress and style after Rolling Stones guitarist Keith Richards and the cartoon skunk Pepe Le Pew. But, can you identify the most common sparrow seen in Oak Shores? It is *Junco hyemalis*, a medium-sized sparrow that you will find foraging on the ground. Don't know the name, I will give you a hit, Junco and the bird has dark eyes. OK, I will tell you the name, *Junco hyemalis* is the Dark-eyed Junco.

How a Dark-eyed Junco looks depends on where it lives. There are many regional differences, but I will only be describing the junco found in Oak Shores. Our Junco has a blackish hood, chestnut-brown back, buff-brown flanks and a white belly. It has a pink conical shape bill and of course dark eyes. The tail is

fairly long and is dark except for the two prominent white outer tail feathers. A Junco is about 5-6.5 inches long, with males being about 5% larger than females. The blackish hood is paler in females and juveniles have heavily streaked breasts.

You will find Dark-eyed Juncos hopping on the ground looking for food. They are primarily seedeaters. If you want to have Juncos at your bird feeder try filling it with millet seeds, they seem to like millet better than sunflower seeds. Birds need more protein during the breeding season and the Junco eats insects including beetles, moths, butterflies, caterpillars, ants, wasps, and flies to supplement its diet.



Dark-eyed Juncos are unique sparrows because they nest on or near the ground. They breed in coniferous or mixed-coniferous forests and Oak Shores is a Blue Oak-Foothill Pine Woodland (mixed coniferous). Breeding season begins in April with the males courting the females. Females seem to prefer males that show more white in the tail. Once the female accepts the male they form a monogamous bond. The female chooses a nest site that is usually well concealed under weeds, grasses, fallen logs, tree roots, or under a building. The female builds the nest but the male often helps by bringing nest

material. She uses her beak to weave together plant materials to build a cup nest, and then lines the cup with fine grasses, mosses or mammal hair.

The female lays 3-5 eggs and incubates them for 12-13 days. Born naked except for dark gray downy fluff on the back, the young are blind and helpless. Both parents tend the young and both parents defend their territory. The young leave the nest in 10-13 days and will remain partially dependent on their parents for about 3 more weeks. The average lifespan of Juncos is approximately 3 to 11 years. Most commonly, predation by other species limits their lifespan. Because Juncos inhabit open areas many



different birds, including sharp-shinned hawks and owls, attack them. Feral and domestic cats also frequently kill them. In response to predators, adults flee to nearby shelter. Parents give "chips" excitedly and fly around nest areas when predators are present and sometimes even dive at predators attempting to prey on nestlings or eggs.

### **FUN FACTS**

The Dark-eyed Junco is one of the most common birds in North America.

A recent estimate set the Junco's total population at approximately 630 million individuals.

A flash of white tail feathers serves as an alarm to other members of the flock.

The oldest recorded Dark-eyed Junco was 11 years 4 months old.

Juncos are the "snowbirds" of the middle latitudes. Over most of the eastern United States, they appear as winter sets in and then head northward each spring.

# WHERE ARE YOU FROM? TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF, YOUR FAMILY AND HOW YOU CAME TO BE A CONTRACTOR.

### Get Ready for Fire Season — Get Defensible Space

Homes with defensible space have a much greater chance of surviving a wildfire than homes without.

We at the California Fire Safe Council encourage you to give your house a fighting chance during a potential wildline by establishing your defensible space.

Defensible space breaks up the continuous path of plants that could carry wildfire to your home. And it gives firefighters a safe zone from which to fight a wildfire. It's worth your effort.

### Defensible Space: You Can Do It

- Remove all flammable vegetation around all structures. State law requires a minimum of 100 feet of clearance, but check with your insurance agent to see if your carrier requires more. For more information about state law, contact your local fire department.
- Trim trees so branches are six feet from the ground and 10 feet from your chimney. Remove branches eventuaging your roof.
- Call your utility company for help with trees near power lines. Never trim these yourself.
- U Romove any dead trees.
- U Cut woods and doed grasses six inches or shorter.
- Always work early in the morning and make sure your power tools have spark arresters to prevent equipment-caused fires.
- Ask your local nursery about landscaping with beautiful, fire-resistant plants.
- Maintain defensible space by cleaning up plant litter and watering properly.




