We are moving forward to get these CC&Rs passed.

Speaking about the CC&Rs, I was a little surprised at the vote count. Although it did well, I expected more yes votes than we received. Was it because of the confusing, negative and misstated letters from "Burlison, Watts and Marshall"? Were the materials that were sent out confusing? Were your questions not answered? We even changed the wording to many items in the CC&Rs to accommodate the concerns from the community. The CC&Rs need to be brought up to date with current laws, therefore we are moving forward with another vote. There is a cost every time we go for a vote, if you voted no, let us hear your concerns so that we don't have to do this again.

Now, on to some great news... The search is over! By the time you read this, our new Oak Shores Manager will have already taken the helm. We posted an advertisement on two websites that are devoted to professional association managers and received about 30 resumes. Meet Your Neighbors

Earl and JoAnn Reynolds have lived full time at Oak Shores since 2004. As you will read later on in the article, they have led a very interesting and adventurous life traveling and living around the world with numerous stories to tell.

The walls in their home are filled with family pictures and paintings from their travels. Instead of putting their pictures in albums, Joann has made collages and beautifully framed all of their family and life history pictures. It was fun and heart warming to not only see the pictures but to hear the pride and love

in each of their voices when they fondly recalled memories and told stories about all their family, friends and pets they have treasured during their lives.

Earl and JoAnn are both from Oklahoma and met in 1955 at a drive-in movie theater where they worked. They just recently celebrated their 51st anniversary. They have two grown children. Their daughter, Kim, works as a student advisor at Cal Poly; and their son, Ken, who lives in Sacramento and has a law firm. They have four grandchildren, Jessica (25), Donnie (23); Rebecca (13); and Madeline (12).

They went to North Carolina when Earl joined the Army and trained as a paratrooper. He was sent to Cypress for his first tour of duty where it was recognized that Earl has a special skill for learning languages easily. He was then reassigned to the Defense Language Institute at Monterey, California. As an honor student there he became fluent in Spanish and Greek and also later learned Lingala, which is a major language of Africa. Because of his linguistic skills, he was then recruited by the National Security Agency to work all over the world. He traveled to and worked in 46 different countries (Greece, Cypress, Africa, Mexico, El Salvador, Vietnam, to name a few). Greece was their favorite. Earl and JoAnn kept on moving around with their young children, two dogs and a cat. They reminisced about the many times they found themselves in very dangerous situations when sudden outbreaks of civil unrest and wars unfolded in front of their eyes with no warning.

In 1980 while in El Salvador, Earl was told he would be sent back to Greece. He had had enough of overseas assignments, so he decided to quit and move his family back to Monterey. He joined the Salinas Police Department where he was a drug officer working closely with the DEA and FBI for sixteen years. He retired from the Salinas PD as a detective in 1998. He was a super athlete and at the age of 46, he was the oldest recruit for the police department, but proceeded to set a fitness record including doing 661 consecutive sit-ups and 186 consecutive push-ups. When he was younger, he also ran a 50-mile super marathon.

JoAnn worked for the Social Security Administration in Monterey for 28 years before she retired in 2004. She worked her way up the ladder from data entry operator to Deputy Director for the Salinas Data Operation Center. She was the lead person helping to implement a major transition involving 400 people to convert the entire Salinas Data Operation Center to a Teleservice Center.

When not at their second home in Pismo Beach, they live the quiet life at Oak Shores with their Pomeranian dog, "Cher". JoAnn enjoys reading and sitting in her backyard watching their wild pet chipmunk "Alvin" eat the nuts they feed it. Earl has had some medical problems resulting in some limitations with their activities, but they always look forward to spending time with their children and grandchildren. You can see Earl, with his walking stick, and JoAnn next to his side on their daily 3-mile route from Shoreline to Saddle Way. They both served on the Elections Committee and have contributed significantly to the Oak Shores Community and are one of the nicest couples you'll meet.


Our newly remodeled Oak Shores gift shop, **LOGOS**, is up and running! The grand opening was held over Memorial Day weekend.

CC&Rs

Good News - Bad News - Encouraging News

There seems to be a lot of discussion in Oak Shores concerning the current status of the CC&Rs and our Community, so I thought it would be a good time to bring us up to date.

The good news is that the Association's required Reserve Account is fully funded, our projected operating budget is on target, the new pool is in, and the restated Bylaws were approved. The bad news is that the CC&Rs did not pass even though the majority of votes cast were in favor of adopting them. Feedback we've received is that because of negative and misleading letters sent out before and during the voting period, members who would have voted "yes" for the CC&Rs, instead voted "no", while many decided not to vote at all. Consequently, we fell short of the required amount of affirmative votes needed for approval (75% of the membership).

This is extremely worrisome. Because of our growing diverse population and the increasing complexity of issues facing our community, we need governing documents that are complete, concise and meet current legal requirements. Our existing CC&Rs lack specificity. They are inadequate in terms of detail which, in turn prevents the Association from properly handling the growing number of unique situations that are occurring more and more often. Since the current CC&Rs do not comply with new state regulations that emphasize equal protection for <u>all</u> residents, they allow, as they have allowed in the past, self-serving individuals or small, vocal, self-interest groups to take charge.

In terms of actual regulations, there are items in the current CC&Rs that no longer apply and are in fact, detrimental to the members. For example, our current CC&Rs allow non-property owners (renters, developers, realtors, etc.) to be "Associate Members" in our Association. This entitles non-members to serve on the Board and make decisions that affect homeowners. Is this what we want in our governing documents? The restated CC&Rs allow only property owners to be Members of our Association.

There is another critical issue to consider. Selling a property under the current CC&Rs could become more difficult. An increasing number of lenders include the quality/legal aspect of an Association's CC&Rs in their criteria for approving loans to private parties who wish to purchase in a private community. Our current CC&Rs do not meet their standards, increasing the likelihood that potential buyers might have trouble obtaining favorable loans. For the homeowner who wants quality living and a secure investment, there are no good reasons to not approve new CC&Rs.

People come to Oak Shores for various reasons. Full and part-time resident owners most likely are looking for a comfortable environment along with enjoyment of the lake, mountains and our unique amenities. They want assurance that their investment is secure. To other members, living in Oak Shores offers income opportunities. In most cases, these members' involvement in construction contracts, real estate sales, rental management and the offering of various services enriches and is of great benefit to our community. The majority of these people care about the community as a whole and conduct themselves in ways that compliments and enhances the quality of Oak Shores. Unfortunately, there are those whose only interest in Oak Shores is income related. These people do not want to be accountable to the membership for their actions or inactions – even those detrimental to Oak Shores. These same individuals feel that more definitive CC&Rs, rules, and regulations require higher standards and accountability and, therefore, only get in their way.

Questions that affect individuals and the community will continually arise. How we respond to these questions inevitably will present a challenge. We will not always agree, but we should always make the best decisions we can. In order to do this, we as Members must be sure that we know the facts, obtain logical answers/explanations knowledgeable sources, recognize when statements are taken out of context, and not be influenced by rumors. This, in addition to attending Board meetings and participating on committees is the best way to protect our investment and contribute to creating an atmosphere that gives pleasure and peace of mind to anyone who sincerely wants the best for Oak Shores and all of its residents.

Chronology of Oak Shores' CC&Rs/Bylaws

1971 – Oak Shores Community Association was incorporated as a non-profit Corporation. The specific and primary purpose of OSCA is to provide community services and recreational facilities for the general use, benefit and welfare of the owners of residential lots within the certain real property commonly known as Oak Shores Subdivision located in the County of San Luis Obispo, California.

1971 – Supplementary Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs) for Oak Shores were implemented by the General Resource Development Corporation.

1977 - Bylaws to Oak Shores' CC&Rs were implemented.

1985 – California enacted the Davis-Stirling Act to deal with California laws pertaining to Private Communities; from 1985 to 2007, the Act has gone through about 21 revisions.

2001 – Oak Shores Board of Directors made a serious attempt to bring the CC&Rs up to date and in compliance. Unfortunately, it was not successful.

2006 - California made major changes to the Davis-Stirling Act resulting in Associations and their Boards of Directors having greater responsibilities and more accountability to the State.

2007 – Board of Directors hired Adams-Kessler law firm (a leading law firm specializing in CC&Rs) to revise the Bylaws and CC&Rs. Bylaws were approved by the membership in May. Board is in the process of preparing restated CC&Rs for another membership vote.

Right in Our Own Backyard

Chimney Rock Road begins where Nacimiento Lake Dr. (G-14) makes its turn north, about 7 miles from Paso Robles. Instead of turning right, just continue going straight. You will come into an area that is rich in scenery, lavish vineyards, and a narrow winding road that demands a slower pace of driving. Most lost drivers feel there is no end to the road. But, miles before RDR, there is also a world famous Bed & Breakfast, a world famous restaurant, and 2 very world renowned wineries: Justin Winery and Carmody McKnight Winery. 5 Bars All the Time at Oak Shores

How important is your cell phone at Oak Shores? Are you frustrated with no or weak "fringe area" reception and dropped calls. If your cell phone is important and you are frustrated I have a solution for you. I got the information from Tom Engleman, a retired network engineer from Hewlett Packard, who recently moved from Oak Shores to Northern California. I'm happy to pass it on.

The solution requires a one time purchase of equipment to capture the cell phone signal, then amplify it, and finally distribute it throughout your house. Specifically, you need a Yagi antenna that is a small roof antenna designed specifically for cell phone reception, a small amplifier that is installed in your attic or crawl space above your living area, a dome antenna about the size of a half a softball that attaches to the ceiling and the cabling to connect the three parts. The total cost is less than \$500 dollars. It requires no maintenance once installed and will work with any cell phone or cell phone company.

Here are two WEB sites that provide all the technical and purchase information you may need. www.wilsonelectronics.com is the manufacturer with excellent information about the products and installation process. The local store that sells this Wilson equipment is in Fresno and online at www.primecellular.com. Both companies have excellent customer service phone lines as well. Wilson (1-866-294-1660) and Prime Cellular (1-800-713-3001).

There is a simple test to see how well it works at your house. You can purchase a Yagi antenna for \$60 and a \$10 cable to directly attach to you phone or you can call me and I'll will bring my Yagi antenna to a Member's house and measure the strength of the signal. My number is in the book.

As a final note, Wilson also makes similar equipment specifically for a vehicle if that may be your need.

Day-Trippin' From Oak Shores...

There are lots of fun day trips just minutes from Oak Shores. When you need a break from the lake or just feel like exploring, head out and discover all the Central Coast has to offer!

WILLIAM R. HEARST STATE BEACH & SAN SIMEON BAY TRAIL

Just over an hour from Oak Shores, the San Simeon Bay Trail offers an alternate to the standard (but always fun) Hearst Castle tours. Located north from the Castle and the San Simeon Pier, this hike offers some of the best coastal views around.

This is an easy, beginners-level hike with no major incline, and excellent views after only a few minutes walking time. You'll see distant Castle and St. Lucia Mountain views, as well as panoramic outlooks over San Simeon Bay and cliffs. The walk is approximately 1-½ hours roundtrip, give or take time for taking pictures and exploring.

The trail begins as a short beach hike heading north from the state beach lot. A few hundred yards down the beach just past the beautiful old Hearst beach home, you'll see the trailhead climbing up through the grass and winding north along the bluff.

Almost immediately, you'll be in the eucalyptus groves and tall pines. At the bluff top, be sure to look back south for an amazing view of the pier and bay. A little further towards the point, you'll see a much-photographed blowhole with coastal pines hanging over the rocks below. Venture further, and find yourself inside a tree tunnel of ancient cypress. Continue on, and see stunning coastal outlooks with seasonal wildflowers and butterflies, hidden beaches, and dramatic rock formations.

Getting there:

From Paso Robles take 101 South to Hwy. 46W. Follow 46 to Hwy 1 and go right (north) towards Cambria. A few miles past Cambria keep your eye out for the pier. Turn left into the William R. Hearst State Beach parking lot.

Safety Committee Projects Move Forward Diane Taylor

The new camera system was installed at the gate on the 15th of May. Staff now has the ability to capture more detailed vehicle information including license plates entering and leaving Oak Shores. This information can then be submitted to law enforcement if a crime was committed or utilized to identify after-hours entry violators such as guests and renters who have entered the community without paying watercraft fees.

This new system also includes an audio microphone that records all conversations at the gate. This capability will provide an objective and accurate recording should there be a dispute between owners or guests and staff. Signs and window stickers are posted at the gate kiosk indicating audio and video recording are in-progress.

This new system will support up to 16 digital cameras, allowing us to install additional cameras at the pool and marina area should that be required in the future.

In addition, the two black & white cameras that were replaced at the gate were moved to the trash compound area and connected to a DVR. These cameras will record all activity at the trash compound enabling any illegal dumping violator to be identified.

These security improvements together with the longer gate hours during the summer are already demonstrating their value in terms of enhanced security at the gate and reduced illegal dumping at our maintenance yard community trash area.






